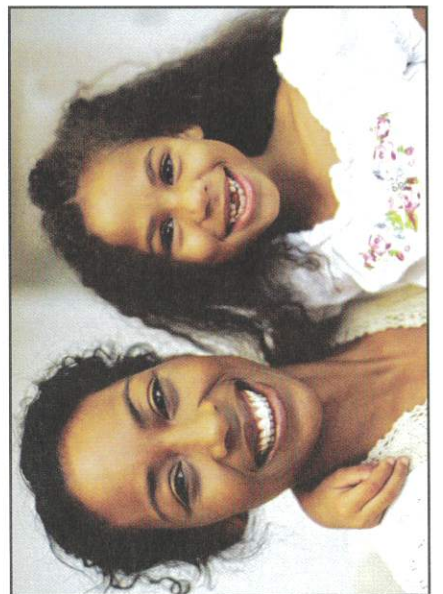




### Employability Tips!

Activities are designed to provide education and training assistance for SNAP recipients to increase their opportunities to obtain sustainable employment. Services are provided through several components including:

- Work Readiness Training
- Vocational Training
- Basic Education
- Work Experience & Workfare
- Job Retention Services
- On the Job Training
- Pathways Scholarship Program
- Quick Jobs Scholarship Program
- Start Smart Entrepreneurship Program

**Support services are also available.**

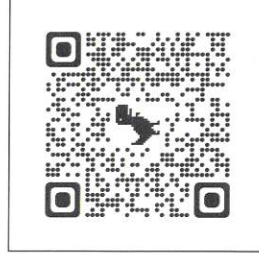
## Who is eligible to participate in the SNAP E&T Program?

- You must have an open SNAP case
- You must be 16 years of age or older
- You are not attending high school
- You must reside in South Carolina

## Services for Able Bodied Adults Without Dependents (ABAWDs)

The SNAP Employment and Training Program has developed specific components that will assist ABAWDs with improving chances of becoming employed by providing educational training and volunteer opportunities that will allow ABAWDs to remain eligible for SNAP while pursuing self-sufficiency. Referrals to community resources and partner agencies are also available.
