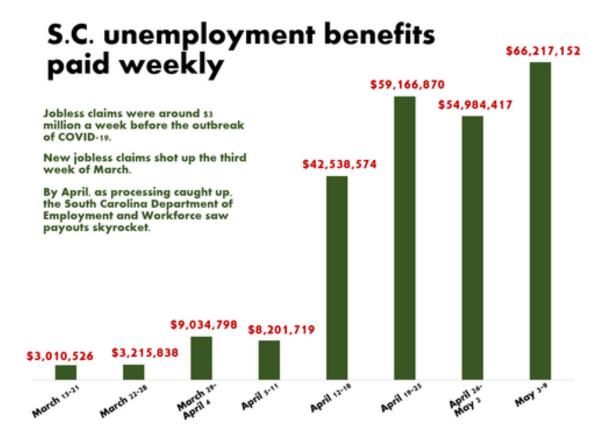

Delivery of Employer Services

We continue to deliver all the usual workforce services to employers. Much of our business has been done via email, telephone, Zoom, conference calling, etc. Many of our employers are not allowing visitors onsite. Some employers have higher demand for their products or have adjusted their processes to enable the manufacturing of essential goods used in the wake of the Covid-19 pandemic. We have assisted with immediate recruiting needs of employers by creating Facebook posts and adding them to our Hot Jobs lists.

MEC (Greenwood County) is closing in August of 2020

Recall Taskforce – Returning to Work

Unemployment Claimants earn regular UI benefits plus and additional \$600 weekly until July 25, 2020. The majority of UI Claimants will exhaust benefits in August 2020. If they refuse to return to their employer when needed, it is likely that their benefits will end. To deal with the recall of workers SCDEW created a Recall Taskforce to guide employers in their employee recall efforts.

While many South Carolinians will be relieved and excited to return to the security of long-term employment, there will be some who still have barriers, such as childcare, that will prevent them from immediately returning to work. There will also be those who prefer – for various reasons – to continue collecting unemployment insurance even though they could, and should, return to work.

Recall Taskforce: To help employers navigate questions as they reengage their workforce, the agency has created the Recall Taskforce. In addition to helping employers understand the different federal funding programs available to their workforce and the eligibility requirements of each one, the Recall Taskforce wants businesses who are reopening to know that their employees cannot refuse an offer for work without good cause if they wish to continue to collect unemployment insurance.

Individuals who have turned down offers of suitable work are not eligible to continue receiving UI benefits. If you have offered an individual a job and they refused, it is important for you to report the incident to DEW through your <u>Employer Self Service Portal</u>.

For the duration of the COVID-19 state of emergency, a disqualification may be imposed if DEW determines a written offer of suitable work was refused, regardless of whether it was sent to the claimant by registered mail, certified mail, U.S. Mail, email or text message. Whenever possible, employer should follow up with their employees via email, phone or text to confirm the offer was actually received. Supporting documentation will help DEW make the right decision in adjudicating recall issues.

Upper Savannah SC Works Re-opening Information

SCWorks Centers in Greenwood, Laurens, and Newberry will re-open to the public beginning June 3, 2020.

- Security Guards will check visitors in, direct those without appointments to the scheduling options, and
 provide disposable face mask, etc. We have had past issues with upset customers and know there is a
 heightened frustration level with UI claimants being denied benefits and with their troubles reaching a
 live person by calling. In addition, news reports have indicated situations arising when people are
 asked to where a mask. Security staff is needed to provide a safe work environment at this time.
- Additional space in Greenwood and Laurens Centers has been secured to allow for social distancing to be enforced while serving as many customers as possible. Without increased space, our ability to serve the public would be greatly limited.
- Public access to SC Works Centers is available via <u>appointment only</u> (appointments can be scheduled online via <u>www.upperscworks.com</u> or by calling the local SC Works Center)
- Disposable masks will be provided for customers entering the centers, Staff will wear face mask when in common areas/ in contact with visitors, Washable/ reusable face masks will be provided for all staff
- Software installed on customer computers to allow for staff to provide oversight and assistance while safely distanced from customers.
- Reusable gloves will be provided for staff conducting cleaning, Disposable gloves are available for visitor use
- Disposable keyboard and mouse covers will be utilized to aid in sanitization
- Hand Sanitizer and Disinfecting Cleaners have been secured
- Centers will close from 12 1:30 each day to allow for staff lunches and mid-day cleaning of high touch surfaces
- SC Works and Partner Agency staff were polled/ surveyed re: return to in-person services and areas of concern have been addressed (ex. Security, space, and clean work environments).

Budget Comments

- 1. Unless we get new money, we will have difficulty serving all of the laid off workers who may need our assistance. Last year's budget was appropriate for a 4% unemployment rate. We will have less money than last year.
- 2. We will have significant increased costs for security, supplies and space.
- 3. There is the possibility of money from a state projects account. Future CARES Act money may increase funding for workforce services. During the last recession, our budget tripled.
- 4. We are in the fifth month of an 18 month contract with GLEAMNS Human Resources Commission.

Staff Recommendations

- 1. Authorize additional space and security for August. It will be when most UI claims are exhausted.
- 2. Continue contract with GLEAMNS but monitor expenditures.
- 3.Look to reduce nonstaff expenditures at the COG but maintain staffing.
- 4. Pass annual budget at August meeting when we know more. If we do not get additional funding may have to freeze training and cut staff.
