New Entrants

- 2,200 high school graduates each year
- Technical college graduates
- Four-year colleges
- Advantage: May not have to bid up wages. New workers do not have bad habits learned from other jobs.
- Strategies: Coop jobs, internships, on-campus recruiting

Career Changers

- Hospitality industry
- Advantage: Knows food, maybe seeking high wages and more stability
- Strategies: Targeted database messaging

Existing Workers

- Automotive industry fluctuations
- Those in un-airconditioned buildings
- Workers seeking better shifts/closer commutes
- Advantage: Already knows manufacturing
- Strategies: Targeted database messaging, evening, or weekend job fairs, social media

Upper Savannah Occupational Projections

The following results represent a ranking of projected employment in sectors based on the combined relative effects of three standardized (Z-Scores), highly predictive varibles-% of workforce, 2018 Upper Savannah median wage, and projected % change.

Weighted Variable Index Score = 39.33 (Z-Score Percent of Workforce) + 33.33 (Z-Score 2018 Upper Savannah median wage) + 27.33 (Z-Score projected % change)
