A quick recap of summer and early fall successes:

- Eckerd Connects, the WIOA service provider, is operational in all counties. Since June they have enrolled 44 new clients. The manager is Kimbearly Smith and you can send potential clients to her at <u>ksmith@eckerd.org</u>, 864.377.9604.
- We held a job fair in Saluda attracting nearly 50 job seekers.
- The regional job fair offered in conjunction with PTC was a huge success, attracting more than 400 job seekers and 80 employers. It was the biggest event since the pandemic.
- Patricia Z. Crawford was recognized at the state Workforce Symposium as Upper Savannah's Workforce Hero.

Workforce Development in South Carolina is undergoing transformation. The Statewide Education and Workforce Act which passed last year is bringing together traditional partners plus adding: K-12, Career and Technology Education centers, four-year colleges, SC Manufacturing Extension Partnership, Department of Veterans Affairs, Economic Development, Parks Recreation and Tourism and First Steps. The goal is to have a unified state plan with performance goals. The Coordinating Council for Workforce Development has had an initial meeting and is listening to groups.

Charles Appleby the council's senior advisor will be speaker for the **December 8**, **Upper Savannah Workforce Partners Meeting**. Workforce Development Board members will be invited as well. He will share the coordinating council's goals. Because we will be working with a wider range of stakeholders in the future, we will invite local representatives from those entities to join us as well.
