## **Help at Centers**

- Review job listings on-line. Most contain wage information.
- Use centers to apply for work.
- Get up-to-date information on careers.
- Apply for Unemployment Insurance and file weekly. (Staff can help, but do not have access to UI system.)

# Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act

Individuals laid off through no fault of their own may qualify for <u>substantial</u> assistance not available to public. Registration is required.

#### Making a Plan

Get the job you want by identifying the skills you already have. You are closer than you think.

#### **Get Help Contacting Employers**

WIOA can call employers on your behalf. This can help you get hired directly in less time.

#### **Arranging Employer-Based Training**

Employers can be offered an incentive to hire and train you. **On-the-Job Training (OJT)** means you might be considered for jobs you are not yet qualified for. This allows you to earn while you learn.

### **Training for Credentials**

**GED Instruction** – Laid off workers may receive a \$500 bonus for getting a GED. Classes are offered in person and online. Computers are available for you to study at home. Take a GED pre-test to see how close you are.

**PATh** – Dozens of popular short-term training options are on a list that is pre-approved. WIOA can pay tuition and associated costs. You may qualify for up to \$10,000 in tuition.

# Piedmont Technical College (and the state tech system)

Free training in manufacturing, healthcare, engineering, construction, IT and more. If you are sponsored by WIOA, out-of-pocket expenses for transportation, childcare, computer loan and equipment can be provided.

Coordination with Unemployment Insurance Benefits. Those receiving payments are required to look for work weekly. After a month, claimants may be referred to specific jobs which match their skills. If they do not contact the employer their benefits may cease. If they are offered a job and decline the job, their benefits may cease. Participating in approved training excepts claimants for the mandatory work search. This means you have more time to invest in your skills so you do not have to settle.
